## Background

Founded by Mel King in 1997 with support from the Tent City Corporation and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's School of Architecture & Planning and Community Fellows Program. SETC teaches adults and young people computer skills that are vital to today's technology-driven economy. We receive support from the Timothy Smith Fund and grants from numerous foundations. We annually serves 1000 + children and adults between the ages of 5-82. The center is staffed mostly by volunteers, and offers a range of courses and programs aimed at reducing joblessness through personal and professional development, all working to provide technology for the community.
